If you are a Careerpilot Pathway Planner college:

Session 1: Getting students registered:

You will need to get students registered in a short Careerpilot session – which could be 15-60 minutes, depending on the time you can allow. In this session students will register and explore the site. When students are registered THEN you can create a PP group and give them, and any relevant staff, access to their group
